

Handwriting Made Simple

Prepare your students for a handwriting lesson with this nifty idea. Teach handwriting placement as though letters lived outside. Refer to the area above the dotted line as the sky, below the dotted line as the grass, and below the bottom solid line as the ground. Students will easily recognize and remember correct placement with this method. **Handwriting**

Bend, Trace, and Write!

Here's a tactile way for young writers to practice letter formation! When a child is having trouble writing particular letters, help him shape pipe cleaners into the letters. Have him trace over each letter with his finger several times and then write the letters on a dry-erase board. Encourage the youngster to refer to his pipe cleaner letters as needed.

Space Sticks
